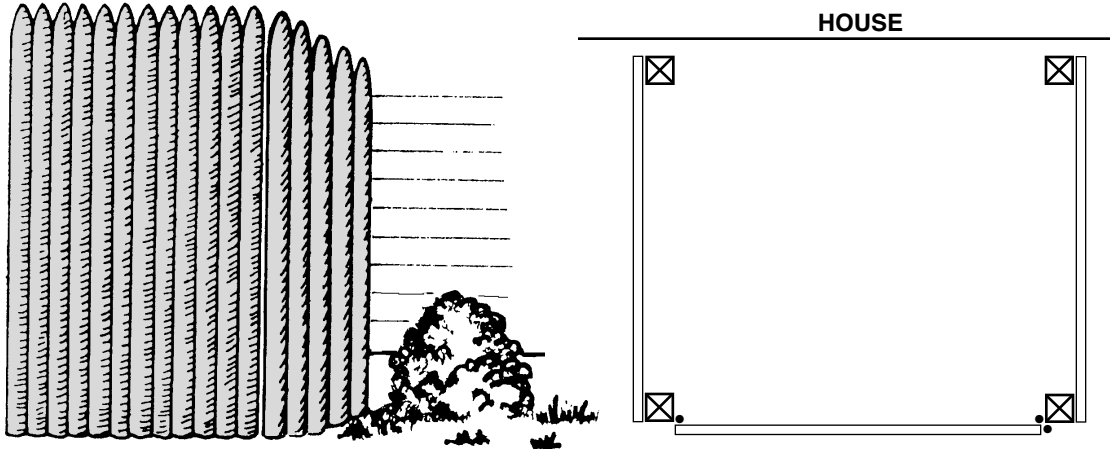


# Do-It-Yourself Project Outdoor Shower

Plan Your Outdoor Shower In Seven Easy Ways!



## Materials You'll Need:

- Four (4) 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" garden timbers or use 4" x 4" pressure treated lumber.
- Two (2) 6' x 8' stockade fence sections.
- 1 lb. 3" weather challenger galvanized screws or 16d HD common nails.
- One (1) 6" screw hook, strap hinges and one (1) gate latch.

## Begin Your Shower By:

1. Cut fence sections in half. (Simply cut 2 x 3 on back of fence section.) This gives you four (4) 6' x 4' wide sections.
2. Set all four posts approximately 2' to 2-1/2' deep, square to each other 4' apart. (No closer than 2" to your house.)
3. Mount fence sections to posts with screws or nails. (Predrilling is recommended.) Be sure to mount sections at least 2" to 3" off ground to allow for proper drying.
4. Mount strap hinges on 2 x 3 of fence section, then attach to post with pins.
5. Mount gate latch.
6. Apply a clear wood preservative to your new shower both inside and out for lasting protection or paint to match your home.
7. Place gravel or marble chips on ground with patio blocks on top.



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
